The 'can-do' message has inspired the history of the vessel and of the Boleh Trust

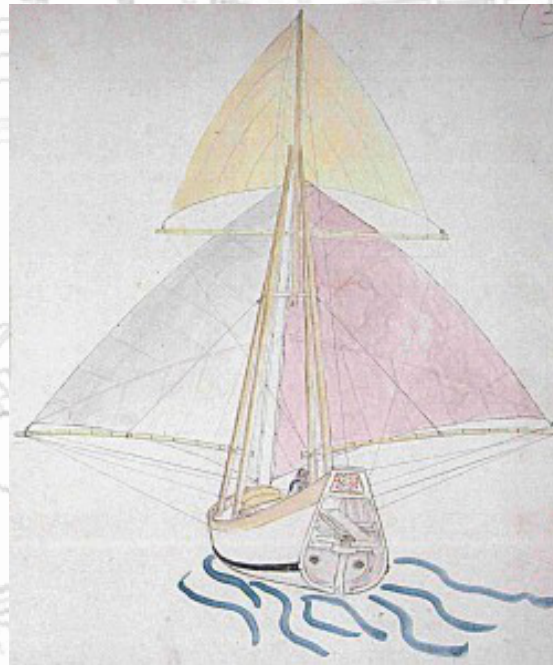
The Boleh Trust:

BOLEH herself is the story of two men who overcame many obstacles to realise their dream: artist and naval war hero Commander Robin Kilroy, DSC, who designed and built his unique 40ft vessel in Singapore with Malay shipwrights before sailing her over 15,000 miles to Salcombe in 1950; and Roger Angel, skilled joiner and entrepreneur, who found her an insurance write-off in 1978 and painstakingly brought her back to life in a Rye harbour mud berth.

30 years later Robin Kilroy's family brought this iconic vessel back from Mallorca to Portsmouth for restoration, setting up the Boleh Trust in 2009 to safeguard her future. A Heritage Lottery Fund grant and many other donations enabled the Trust to set up an Apprentice School and complete BOLEH's restoration to her original design, finally returning her to the water in 2015.

Her traditional build and carefully restored 1949 layout hide a full outfit of 21st Century systems and she is MCA coded to sail offshore in all weathers.
